Chicago Fly



The Chicago Fly is a bead head Mohair Leech pattern.

- 1. Hook = 3x or 4x long with straight eye. #6 12 range with #8 typical.
- 2. Gold brass bead head to match hook
- 3. #6/0 Black Thread
- 4. Tail is 10 12 Black Marabou fibers very thin and spiky ones about 3/4 length of hook shank.
- 5. Red Krystal Flash two pieces tied in on each side of tail. Use one double length and double over for durability.
- 6. Black Mohair yarn body (Wool Mohair, or Uni Hair, or Metz Leach Yarn). Wrap forward, pulling fibers toward top of hook shank. Whip finish thread.
- 7. Slide scissors along bottom of fly and slice loose fibers pull fibers to top of hook.
- 8. Trip fibers on bottom of fly to about 1 hook gap wide.
- 9. Head cement forward thread wraps.

Fish Chicago Fly as a streamer with sink tip line, across current. Can also be dead drifted as a stone fly nymph using a floating line. As a streamer, either strip across current as fast as possible with 8" strips, or fish quartering downstream "on the swing". Very effective with cloud cover or before a rain or right before dark. Use a crackle back or soft hackle dropper, especially if fishing on the swing.
