Why kudos? Gerry McDaniel, DCFF Co-founder, Education Director, Fly Tying Instructor, rod-building teacher, fly-fishing guide and all around good guy was featured in an article in the Winter issue of Kentucky Afield magazine.

The topic is Float and Fly fishing, a technique for coldwater fishing for big bass, Largemouth, Smallmouth, and Spotted, as well as other fish that feed on schools of baitfish that are close-packed because of frigid water temperatures. This is used often in large steep-sided lakes such as Dale Hollow, Cumberland, and Laurel.

It is a technique originally applied by spin fishermen which Gerry has applied to fly-fishing using a 10 foot eight weight and a soft high cast. He will be glad to tell you more.

But the point is: congratulations, Gerry!


