## **President's Letter**

**Opportunities**By Matt Clements

One of the deacons at my church was a veterinarian. He kept me supplied with Heart worm medication and gave my dogs their annual rabies shots.

He retired about 15 years ago. He sold his practice to his partner, and agreed to only see large animals, as she didn't, and it would not interfere with her growing what was now her business.

About 7 or so years ago he supplied me with some natural suture material, commonly called "catgut," so I could experiment with some fly patterns I had seen.

Two or three years ago, after church one Sunday, he asked me to take him fly fishing. I talked with him about what he wanted, I offered to take him out in my boat.

He wanted to wade and fish. And he wanted waders. But he didn't have waders. As best as I could understand from the discussion, he wanted me to buy him waders.

I'm enough of a sucker that I could probably be talked into buying a spare set of waders that someone could borrow, but he was different enough from me that waders that fit one of us would not fit the other.

And he was an older fellow, and I wasn't to keen on dragging him out of the water should he loose his footing.

He asked a few other times if I had gotten him waders yet to go fishing. His wife mentioned that he had wanted to try fly fishing.

I found reasons as to not have had time. I probably could have found some cheap waders, or given him the old heavy rubber hip waders I had in the basement from when Jessy first went fishing with me. I think those may have fit him.

He would occasionally bring up that he wanted me to take him fishing. And I would have a reason to not be able to.

His wife pointed out that they had a pond in their yard, and we could simply fish there. The perfect solution, show up with two rods, teach him to cast, foam spider, bluegill, call it a day.

The mention of the pond was not as straightforward as it sounds there. They had been leaving their house following some cold weather and their driveway had iced over. He had slid off the road into a tree (the opposite side of the road was the pond), and they had been stuck there until their son could get there and help get them out and walk them back to their house.

He had missed church that day, due to being sore from the ordeal. From

there, his health spiraled, and he seemed to spend more time in the hospital than out of it.

I'm in the middle of Eli's birthday party, we got the call that he had passed away.

I don't know if he wanted me to buy waders for him, if he intended to pay for them, I never revisited the conversation after my initial understanding of his expectations. I didn't bring him a rod to practice with. I didn't know he had a pond until it was effectively too late.

What I do know is I had the opportunity to take someone fly fishing that wanted to try it, and I didn't. I feel sad about that. Fly fishing is not nearly as important as other thinkings in my life, but I do, at least I'm my mind, enjoy it. And I found each opportunity to not get him involved because of the burden I didn't want to take on.

I'm sure that there is an important point to this story, but I'm also sure that it isn't really about Fly Fishing.
