Why Do I Have So Many Flies?

On a recent fishing trip river, conditions were a little different than anticipated. We were fishing a river we had fished several times before and the water was lower than we had ever experienced. This called for some changes to our fly rod set ups. On previous trips we used heavy sink tips and leaders. With the lower waters and less current we needed to change our set up to match the conditions. This resulted in a call for a serious meeting of the minds. Our group gathered on the river bank and discussed and strategized the best approach and presentation. What resulted from this grand summit of fly-fishing knowledge was a display of tackle that would be the envy of any serious fly fisher. There was enough fly- fishing tackle among the five of us to open a small Fly Shop. Flies, leaders, tippet, fly lines, reels and extra rods were shown and discussed. I have to say it was an impressive event. The result was that we adjusted to conditions and had success on the trip. Since that trip I've thought about the amount of fly fishing gear I have and why. Here are a few of my thoughts on the matter.

Fishing is an activity driven by emotion. You might question that statement but think about it. Why do you have so many flies? Take a look at the amount of gear you have and ask yourself why you have so much. Could you ever use all that gear in a lifetime? How many flies, lines, rods, reels, waders, nets wading staffs and pliers do you have? We fly fishers never seem to have enough. We keep accumulating more and more gear over the years knowing we'll probably never have enough time to use it. There's not much logic in this and that's the point. It's the emotional picture we paint in our mind of catching that trophy fish and it takes just the right gear and you just have to have it. You're standing in the fly shop looking at rods. You need the perfect rod and, of course, the perfect reel. Then you need the perfect line to go with that rod and reel. You'll also need the perfect leader and tippet so you can make the perfect presentation. It doesn't stop with just one rod, you need a streamer rod, a nymphing rod, a dry fly rod for fish on the rise, and so it goes on and on. There's

not much logic that comes with this massive accumulation of gear and you just can't get enough. You've already hooked that trophy fish in your mind and can't imagine losing the fish of a lifetime because you weren't using the perfect tackle.

What fly do I use? Wow, what a panacea this is. Flies deserve to be singled out. How many do you have? Hundreds? Thousands? How many fly boxes? Let's see, we need a box of drys, nymphs, midges and poppers and a sling bag or vest we can get it all into. Not to mention that we need flies for trout, bass, panfish and so on. If you've been around awhile you've probably started tying your own flies. You may have been under the illusion that tying your own flies is cheaper. Disillusionment comes quickly. It doesn't take long to accumulate fly tying materials and it only adds to the massive collection of gear you already have. You tie flies because with the perfect rod, reel, line and tippet, you have to have the perfect fly. It's only right that we catch that trophy fish on a fly tied by our own hand. There's not much logic to having so many flies, so much gear and so much fun! Truth is, it's the "sweet emotion" of fly fishing that drives us to it.....I need to get to the fly shop!

Raymond Poff is a Professor in the WKU Recreation, Park, and Nonprofit Administration degree

program https://www.wku.edu/recreation/ and is in his 22nd year with WKU. He earned a Ph.D. in Leisure Behavior from Indiana University (IU), M.S. in Recreation (IU), and B.S. in Recreation Management and Youth Leadership from Brigham Young University (BYU).

Prior to an academic career, Raymond worked with university student center outdoor recreation programs at BYU and IU. He is a former licensed whitewater rafting guide and former certified whitewater kayaking instructor.

He has traveled abroad in Canada, Mexico, Brazil, England, France, Australia, New Zealand (5 times), and the Bahamas. He led a 2016, 2018, and 2020 WKU faculty led study abroad course to New Zealand; the course focused on the recreation and tourism industry.

Raymond designed the WKU Fly Fishing Montana program https://www.wku.edu/flyfishing/ in 2011 and led the program in 2012-2019; 2021-2023. In addition, he led a similar program for high school students in the summer of 2016 and 2017 with financial support from the Cabela's Outdoor Fund. Fly fishing and sharing fly fishing with others are among his favorite activities. Sharing Missoula, MT and the surrounding natural resources with others is also very important to him.
