DCFF Tip of the Month:

Do not be intimidated by dirty water - learn to love it.

Abnormal water fluctuations that create "chocolate milk" conditions are a whole different matter, but fish become accustomed to the normal fluctuations in stream and river levels. They learn how to feed effectively in the changing visibility conditions associated with both rising and falling water levels. Fish don't stop feeding when the water becomes stained, murky, or even dirty – they just adapt their feeding patterns to accommodate the changing conditions. Stained or murky water can help keep you hidden from the fish and it indicates that plenty of food is also being carried downstream with the sediment in the water. Fish are seldom feeding in the middle of the murkiest portion of the main current, but you can bet they are set up to feed where that dirty water meets clear (or at least notably cleaner) water flows. These pockets of dirty to cleaner water flow transitions may be limited on your river or stream -- but that is what makes finding concentrations of feeding fish easier.

Effectively fishing dirty water places a premium on your ability to read the water and correctly interpret the behavior of the flow below the surface. The fisherman that can key in on the structure, depth, and current seams to build a mental model of where fish will stack up to feed is the fisherman that will learn to love dirty water.

Water Quality ... follow-up

Our November General Membership Meeting (**GMM**) featured guest speaker **Trent Winlock**, an Environmental Engineer for **MSD** (and avid fly fisherman). Trent discussed water quality in and around **Jefferson County** as well as how stream and river health is monitored by **MSD**. This is Trent's promised follow-up with links referenced during that presentation. This is some great information! Thank you, Trent.

1.) Interactive map showing water quality across the region:

Water Quality Indicators

- Each icon represents one of our monitoring sites
 - Three (3) on the main stem of Floyds Fork
 - Another four (4) on tributaries of the Fork
- Each year can be toggled on/off
- A dropdown for each year allows you to drill down into that year's data
 - Click the ">" symbol
- 2.) Map showing many of the USGS gauges in Jefferson County: <u>USGS National Water Dashboard</u>
 - Each dot represents a gauge
 - Clicking a dot brings up that site's information
 - Most sites also have water quality info available
- 3.) Report on the most recent State of the Streams:

State of the Streams Report

- Published every five years
 - Includes water quality trends in each watershed
 - Includes background information on water quality and biological assessments
- Floyds Fork section starts on page-47 of 2021 Report
- Includes 2 tributaries of the Fork
- Previous reports can be found <u>HERE</u>
 - Use Water Quality Synthesis Reports section

• Started publishing reports in 2009

4.) Information on how MSD monitors streams: <u>MSD Water Quality Monitoring</u>

If any **DCFF** members would like to participate in our **Citizen Monitoring Program**, please contact me. You can adopt a monitoring site and help us keep tabs on some of the smaller tributaries around the county. Long Run (a tributary of Floyds Fork) is of particular interest.

Present:

Evolution:

The **DCFF Newsletter** has evolved, over time, into a mix of our **Weekly Update** information as well as what might be considered more mainstream club news content. The **Constant Contact** web platform we use to create and distribute club communications is ideal for our **Weekly Update**, but is lacking in many features and functionality for creating content you might find in most club newsletters.

Future:

In 2025, we will be stripping out any "what's happening" information from the traditional club news to reduce content bloat and streamline the focus of our **DCFF Newsletter**. You will still receive your **Weekly Update** every Monday, but we will not be repeating that information in the **DCFF Newsletter**. The **DCFF Newsletter** will also be published and distributed on a quarterly basis starting in 2025 instead of the current monthly schedule. You can expect your future **DCFF Newsletters** to be published in **PDF** format with a mid-February, mid-May, mid-August and mid-November quarterly distribution schedule.
